

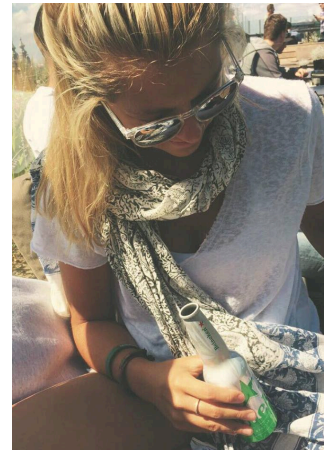


Hi...
